

FY22 Community Population Report

Numbers as of June 30, 2022

During the past fiscal year, the Covid-19 pandemic continued to impact the probation and parole population. As Idaho moved out of the acute phase of the pandemic, the community population decreased. Releases exceeded admissions in both the probation and parole populations. The smaller community population can be attributed at least in part to an increase in the incarcerated population, as admissions to rider and term increased compared to FY2021 while successful discharges remained relatively constant.

 $^{^{1}}$ New Commitments Direct to Parole: Individuals who come to Idaho from another state for the purpose of supervision.


²Retained Jurisdiction (Rider): Individuals whom the court has retained jurisdiction over sentenced to a period of incarceration in an IDOC facility. The IDOC assesses riders to determine their needs and places them in the appropriate facilities to receive intensive programming and education. Upon completion of a rider, the court determines whether to place the resident on probation or sentence them to term.





Parole Population




Probation Population







iiii Demographics

Of the total community population, 73.2% were male. The male population decreased 2.9% in the last fiscal year. The female population decreased 3.6%.

Of the total community population, 31.7% were aged between 25 and 34. The total number of community individuals aged between 25 and 34 has decreased 6.2% in the last fiscal year. Individuals aged between 18 and 24 saw the greatest change, with a decrease of 11.0%.



Of the total community population, 70.2% were white. The white population has decreased 6.9% in the last fiscal year. Of the remaining individuals with a known race/ethnicity, Asian individuals saw the greatest change, with a decrease of 9.9%.
