Kit Carson Correctional Center Fact Sheet

About the Facility:

Kit Carson Correctional Center (KCCC) is a 1488-bed, medium security correctional facility located in Burlington, Colorado, approximately 165 miles east of Denver. Built in 1998, the facility is owned and operated by Correction Corporation of America (CCA), and will house Idaho offenders in a separate section of the facility from Colorado offenders currently housed at the facility. CCA also operates the Idaho Correctional Center south of Boise.

❖ Sending Mail:

Offenders may receive letters and photos (*excluding Polaroids*). All personal letters will be opened and searched for contraband. Packages of any type, as well as sexually explicit or pornographic materials are prohibited. Be sure to include the offender's name, IDOC offender number, and living unit in the address. Any mail received at the offender's prior facility will be forwarded for a period of 60 days.

❖ Sending money to an Idaho offender at KCCC:

Offenders may receive money to be used for commissary purchases and pre-paid phone time. To ensure that the money is applied to the correct account:

- Only money orders or a cashier's check are accepted (made payable to the offender in US Dollars). Cash is not accepted and will be returned to the sender
- Clearly write the offender name and IDOC number on the money order.
- Mail the payment to the KCCC mailing address listed above.

- **Payments will not be accepted at Idaho locations.**



❖ **Talking on the phone with an IDOC offender at KCCC:**



- Offenders may make collect calls to people outside the facility, or may call using a pre-paid phone account set up through the facility's contract vendor.
- Any balance on the offender's phone account at the prior facility will be transferred to the offender banking account, and a new account may be started at KCCC by purchasing phone time through the commissary.
- The facility does not accept incoming calls for offenders.

❖ **To contact an Idaho offender at KCCC in case of a family emergency:**

Call the facility at **(719) 346-9450** and leave a message. The message will be forwarded to the offender only if the emergency involves the death or a life-threatening circumstance involving an immediate member of the offender's family. Emergency incidents are subject to verification of the emergency by KCCC staff.

❖ **Visiting an Offender at KCCC:**

All visitors entering KCCC must be on the offender's approved visitors list, and must comply with facility visiting rules. **Visitors who are currently approved to visit an IDOC facility in Idaho do not need to re-apply to visit at KCCC.** However, before travelling to Colorado, visitors should check with the offender to confirm that their name is on the facility's list of approved visitors. Facility visiting rules are available on the IDOC website.

2. The application will be reviewed and a background check will be completed. **The offender will be notified when an application is approved or denied and will be asked to communicate the results to the applicant.**

❖ **What's being done to keep Idaho offenders healthy and safe at out-of-state institutions?**

IDOC has an oversight unit assigned to monitor contract prison facilities where IDOC offenders are incarcerated, including county jails and all Idaho and out-of-state contract facilities. The team, comprised of veteran correctional professionals, visits each facility regularly to observe and monitor all aspects of operations at the facilities. The team focuses on issues like safety and security, health care, programming and food services, responsiveness to offender concerns, and provision of other required services.
