



FY22 Incarcerated Population Report

Numbers as of June 30, 2022

The Covid-19 pandemic had unprecedented effects on Idaho’s criminal justice system. Efforts to limit the spread of disease led to changes in supervision practices and significant sentencing delays in fiscal years 2020 and 2021. During fiscal year 2022, Idaho began to move out of the acute phase of the pandemic and deal with many court cases that had been delayed. The increase in sentencing contributed an increase in Idaho’s incarcerated population during the last fiscal year, especially in the Termer population.

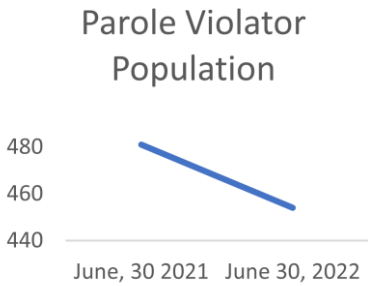
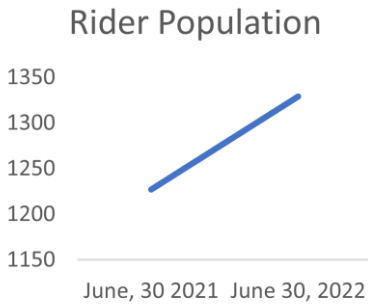
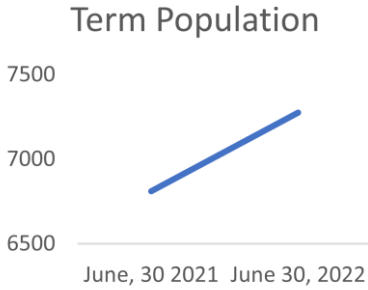

¹Retained Jurisdiction (Rider): Individuals whom the court has retained jurisdiction over sentenced to a period of incarceration in an IDOC facility. The IDOC assesses riders to determine their needs and places them in the appropriate facilities to receive intensive programming and education. Upon completion of a rider, the court determines whether to place the resident on probation or sentence them to term.

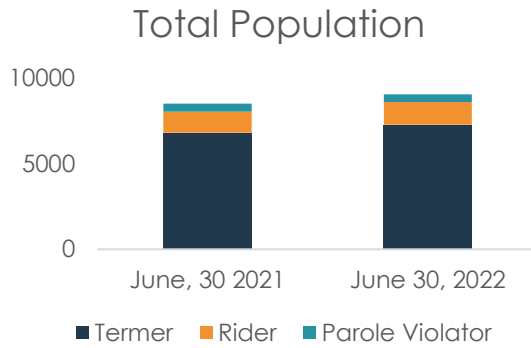
²Parole Violator: An individual who violates the conditions of their parole. This is usually a temporary status until a hearing can be conducted to determine if their parole will be reinstated or revoked.

Numbers as of June 30, 2022



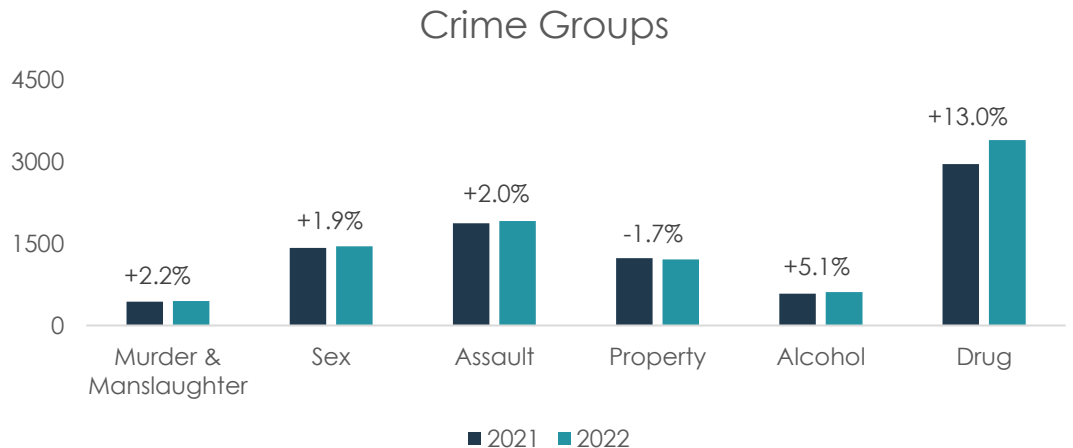
Total Population

There was a 6.3% increase in the incarcerated population from FY2021 to FY2022. The term population increased 6.8%. The rider population increased 8.3%. The parole violator population decreased 5.6%.



Crime Groups

Of the total incarcerated population, 37.5% were sentenced on drug charges. The total number of drug charges has increased 13% in the last fiscal year. With the increase in the incarcerated population all crime groups saw an increase except for property, which declined by 1.7%.

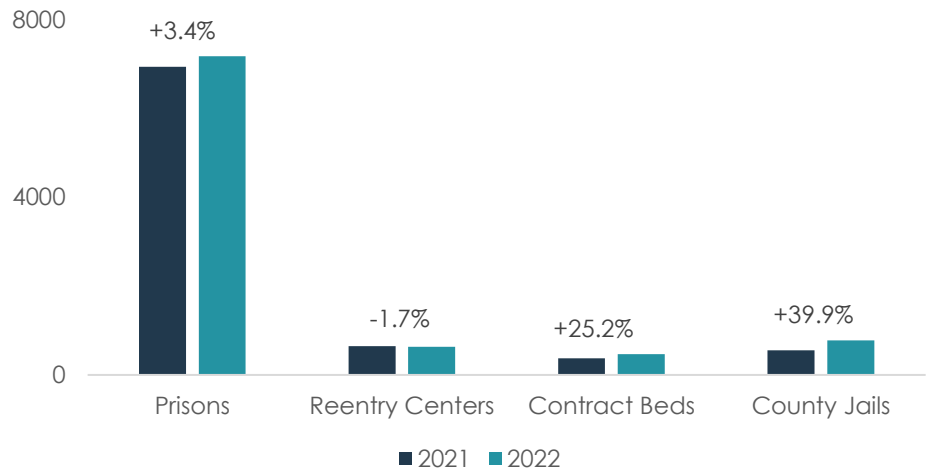
Facility Type

Of the total incarcerated population, 79.2% were held in IDOC prisons. The prison population has increased 3.4% in the last fiscal year, while the reentry center population has decreased 1.7%. Reliance on contract beds and jails increased, with the contract bed population increasing 25.2% and the county jail population increasing 39.9%.

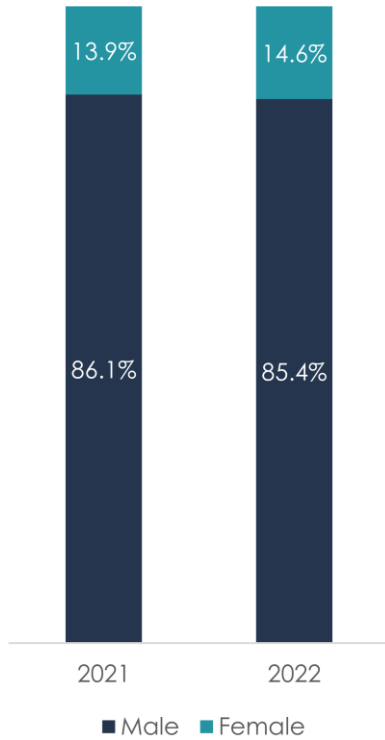

Gender

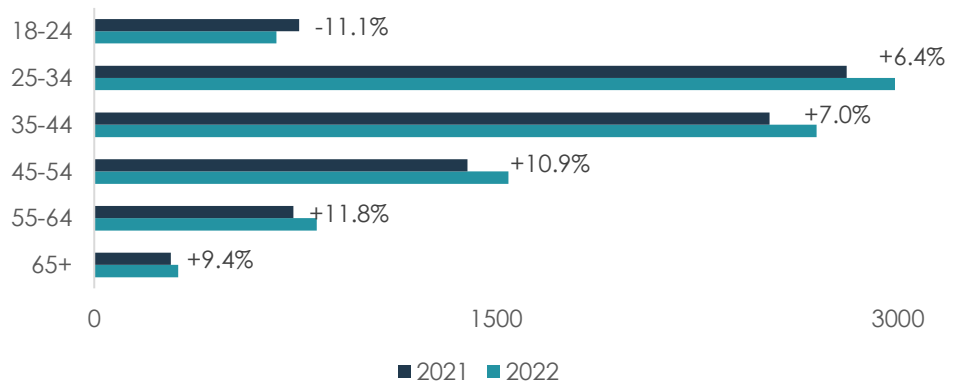


Demographics

Of the total incarcerated population, 85.4% were male. The male population increased 5.5% in the last fiscal year. The female population increased 11.7%.

Of the total incarcerated population, 33% were aged between 25 and 34. The total number of incarcerated individuals aged between 25 and 34 has increased 6.4% in the last fiscal year. Individuals aged 55 to 64 saw the greatest change, with an increase of 11.8%.

Age



Of the total incarcerated population, 73.3% were white. The white population has increased 6.2% in the last fiscal year. Of the remaining individuals with a known race/ethnicity, Asian individuals saw the greatest change, with an increase of 32.4%, although they remain the smallest group.
