

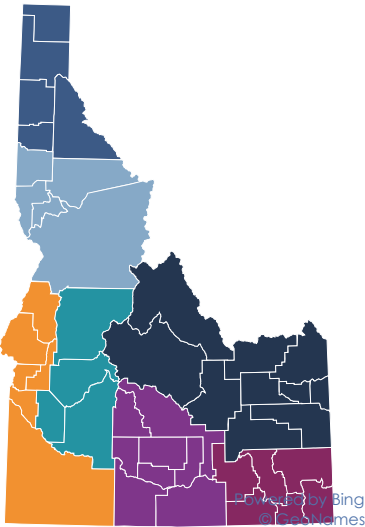

District Map

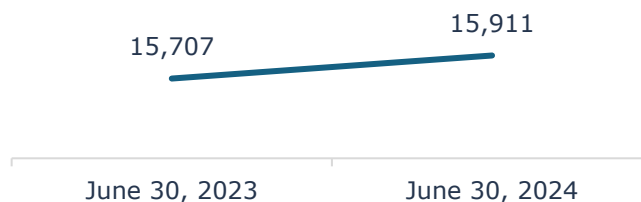


During Fiscal Year 2024, the number of Idaho residents under active supervision increased by 5% compared to FY23. Both probation and parole populations grew, by 5.4% and 4.0%, respectively.

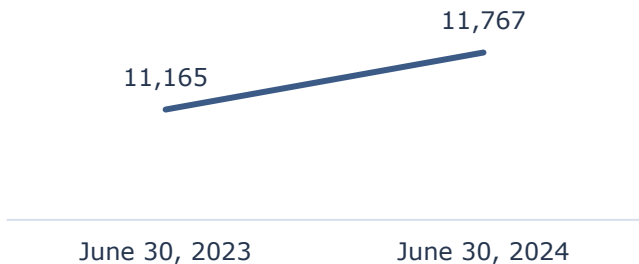
Supervision counts across most districts remained stable from the previous year, with one notable exception: the Low Supervision Unit grew by 21.3%. Demographic distributions by crime type, gender, and ethnicity remained consistent with FY23. However, there was a significant increase among individuals aged 18–24, while other age groups showed little change.

The active supervision population includes individuals in Idaho communities who are on probation or parole. It excludes those who are incarcerated, in federal custody, deported, detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), absconded, on parole violation status, on a bench warrant, or on unsupervised probation.

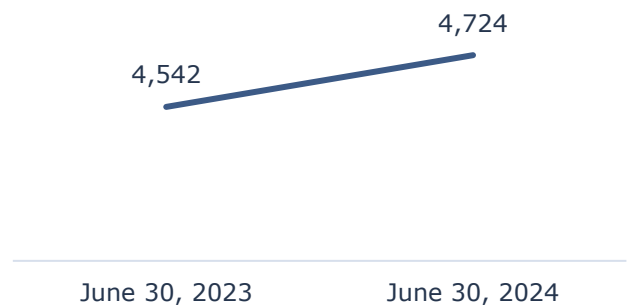
Total Supervision Population

Parole Population





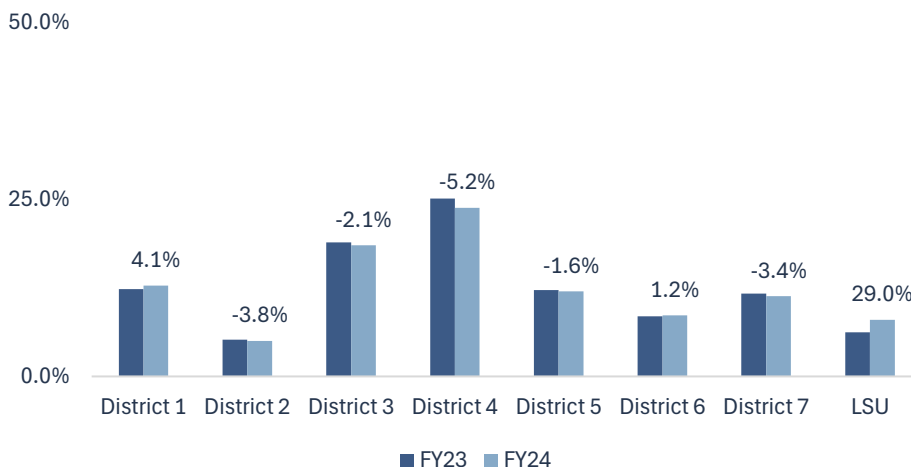

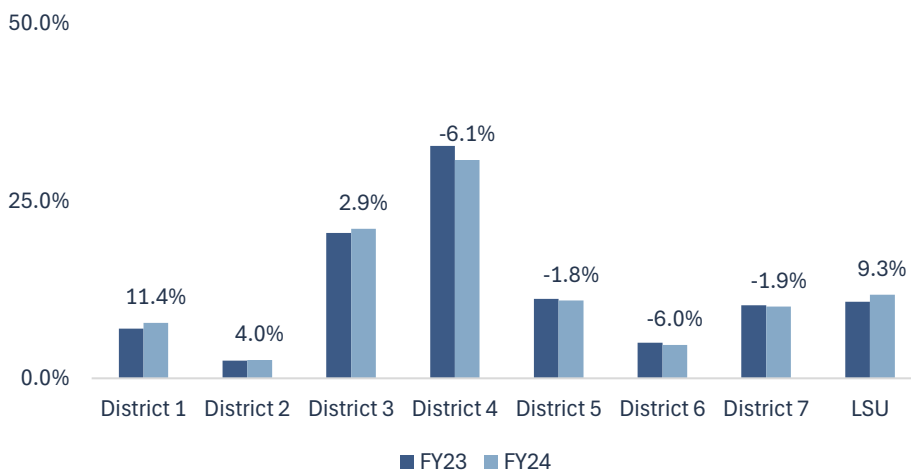

The number of individuals under active supervision across Idaho's districts remained stable between FY23 and FY24.

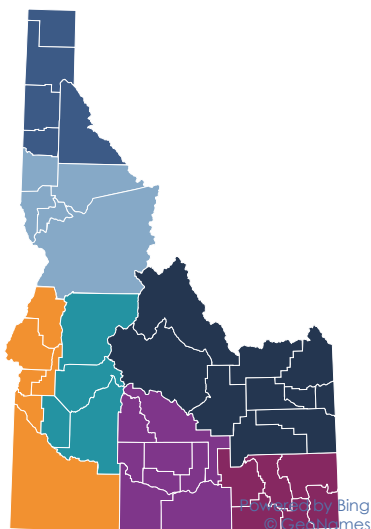
Probation

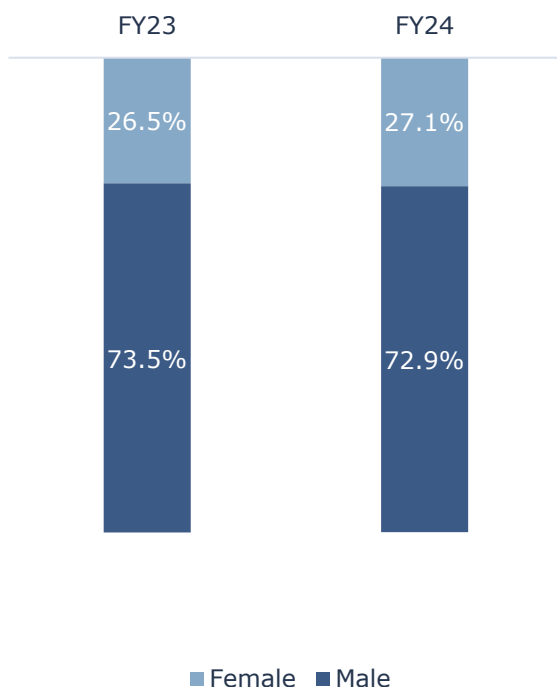


Demographics

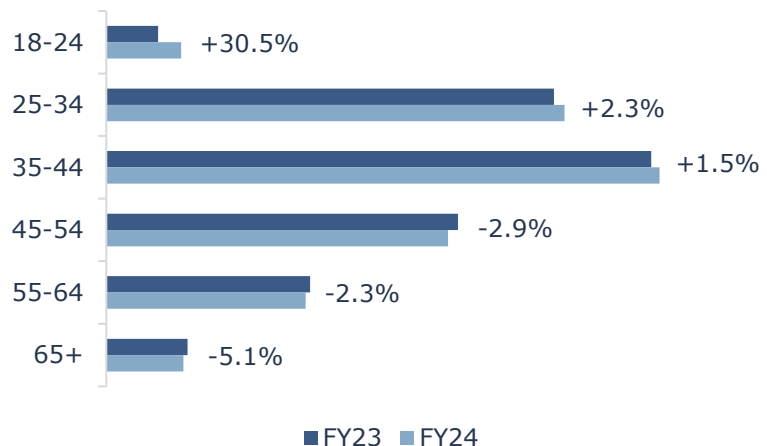
Between FY23 and FY24, the gender distribution of those under active supervision showed no significant change, with males representing 72.9% and females 27.1% of the population for FY24.

The 18–24 age group experienced a notable increase of 30.5%, though it remains the smallest group in terms of total individuals (698). Other age groups remained relatively stable, with those aged 35–44 continuing to represent the largest segment of the supervised population.

Gender

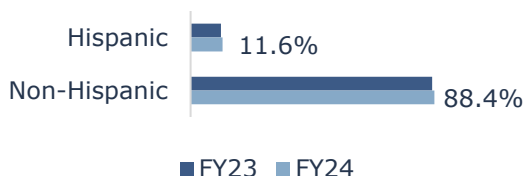


Age

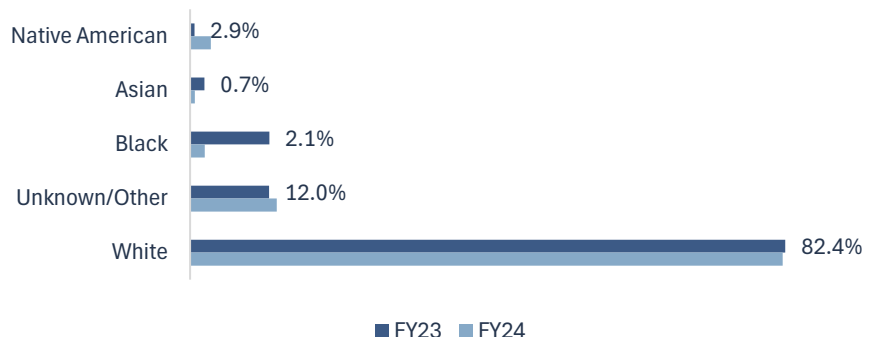


Racial and ethnic composition also remained consistent. Individuals identifying as White accounted for 82.3% of the supervised population, closely aligning with Idaho’s estimated non-Hispanic White population (80.3%).

Race



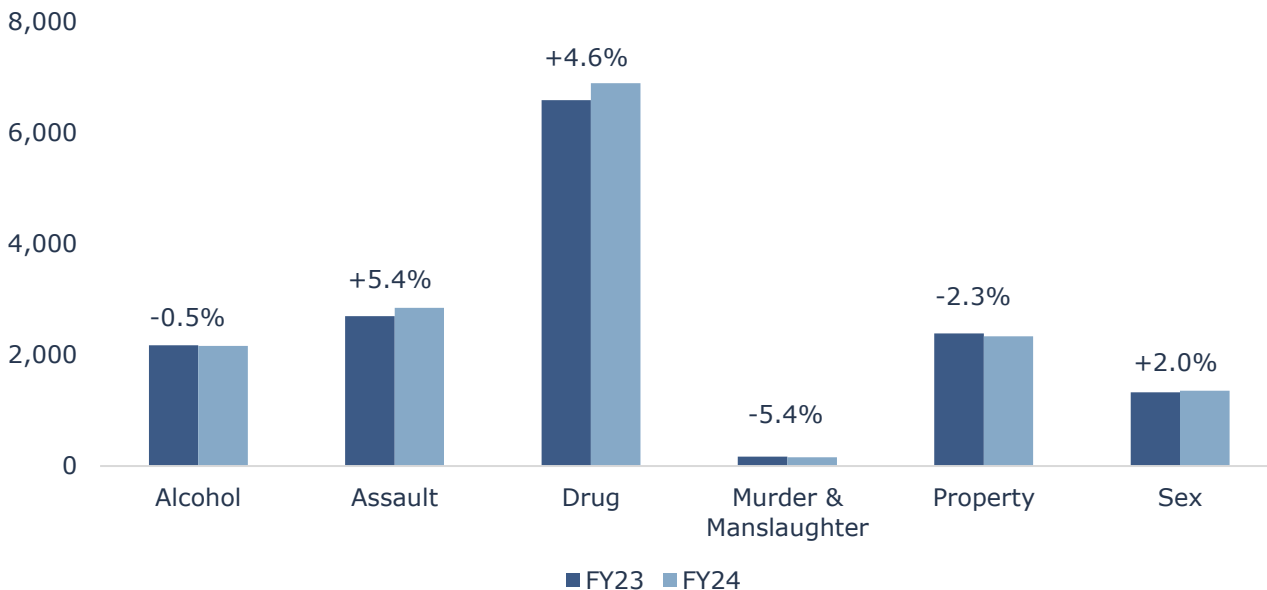


Crime Groups

Crimes are classified into six categories: Murder/Manslaughter, Sex Offense, Assault, Drug, Alcohol, and Property. For individuals convicted of multiple offense types, the crime associated with the longest sentence determines their classification within the supervised population.

Among those under active supervision, Drug Offenses accounted for the largest share (43.8%), while Murder/Manslaughter remained the smallest category. Between FY23 and FY24, there were slight increases in Assault offenses (+5.4%) and Drug offenses (+4.6%); however, no significant overall changes were observed across crime groups during this period.
