

FY24 Incarcerated Population Report Numbers as of June 30, 2024

The FY24 incarceration population increased overall by 4%; Termers (+3.1%), Riders (+6.9%), and Parole Violators experienced a count increase of 49 individuals (+24.1%).

 2 Parole Violator: An individual who violates the conditions of their parole. This is usually a temporary status until a hearing can be conducted to determine if their parole will be reinstated or revoked.

³Retained Jurisdiction (Rider): Individuals sentenced to a period of incarceration in an IDOC facility over whom the court has retained jurisdiction. The IDOC assesses riders to determine their needs and places them in the appropriate facilities to receive intensive programming and education. Upon completion of a rider, the court determines whether to place the resident on probation or sentence them to term.



The IDOC Incarcerated population had a net increase of 4.0% from FY23 to FY24. The Term population increased by 3.1%. The Rider population increased by 3.1%. The Parole Violator population increased by 12.2%.

Total Incarcerated Population





FY24 saw an overall rise across most crime types. The largest crime type population remains drug related, representing 36.5% of the total population and increase from FY23 of 5.9%, property (+6.0), assault (4.9%), alcohol (+4.3%), and sex offenses (2.9%), while murder/manslaughter remained stable (< 1.0%).

Crime Groups





Facility Type

The majority (79.9%) of residents were housed at In-State prison facilities and 6.5% were housed at In-State Community Reentry Centers. Contracted bed accounted for 16.6%, with 6% housed in community jails and 10.6% housed at the Saguaro Arizona facility. This represents a decrease of 27.6% for contracted beds in FY24.



Gender




MM Demographics

Of the total IDOC incarcerated population 84.8% were Male. The Female population increased by 25.8% or a total of 303 individuals.


The largest proportion of people incarcerated fell between the ages of 35 to 44, representing 32.0% of the total incarcerated population.
