FY25 Incarcerated Population Report

Numbers as of June 30, 2025

The FY25 incarceration population increased overall by 2.4%; Termers (+4.4%), Riders (-12.0%), and Parole Violators experienced a count increase of 55 individuals (+12.2%).

¹Parole Violator: An individual who violates the conditions of their parole. This is usually a temporary status until a hearing can be conducted to determine if their parole will be reinstated or revoked.

²Retained Jurisdiction (Rider): Individuals sentenced to a period of incarceration in an IDOC facility over whom the court has retained jurisdiction. The IDOC assesses riders to determine their needs and places them in the appropriate facilities to receive intensive programming and education. Upon completion of a rider, the court determines whether to place the resident on probation or sentence them to term.

The IDOC incarcerated population had a net increase of 2.4% from FY24 to FY25. The Term population increased by 4.4%. The Rider population decreased by 12.0%. The Parole Violator population increased by 12.2%.


Total Incarcerated Population

FY25 saw an overall rise across most crime types. The largest crime type population remains drug related, representing 36.1% of the total population and increase from FY24 of 1.1%, property (+2.7%), assault (5.5%), alcohol (-1.5%), and sex offenses (+1.5%), while murder/manslaughter remained stable.

Crime Groups





Facility Type

The majority (75.3%) of residents were housed at In-State prison facilities and 6.4% were housed at In-State Community Reentry Centers. Contracted bed accounted for 16.6%, with 6% housed in community jails and 10.6% housed at the Saguaro Arizona facility. This represents a decrease of 27.6% for contracted beds in FY25.



Gender




MM Demographics

Of the total IDOC incarcerated population 85.5% were male. The male population increased by 2.8% or 234 individuals.


The largest proportion of people incarcerated fell between the ages of 35 to 44, representing 32.5% of the total incarcerated population.
