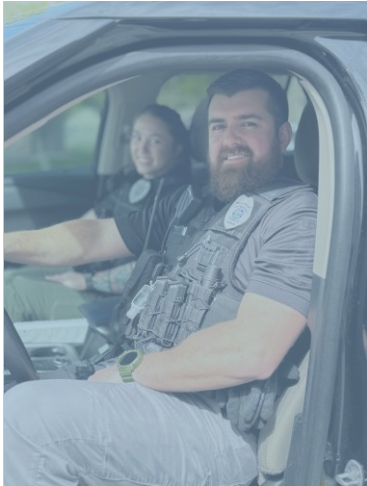




FY26 Community Population Report

Numbers as of June 30, 2026



Overall Trends

The supervision population includes individuals in Idaho communities who are on probation (people sentenced by the court to community supervision) or parole (people granted community supervision by the Parole Commission). It excludes those who are incarcerated, in federal custody, deported, detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), absconded, on parole violation status, on a bench warrant, or on unsupervised probation.

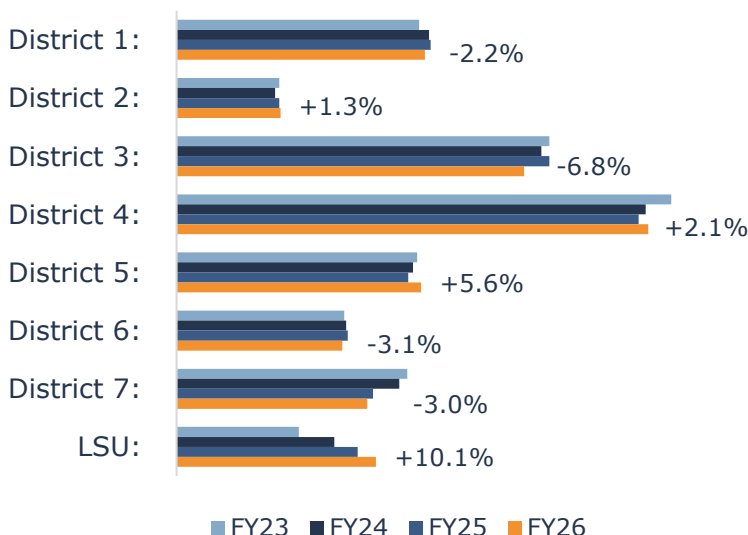
During FY26, the number of Idaho residents under **active supervision decreased by 3.7%** compared to FY25. **The probation population decreased by 6.1%** while the **parole population increased by 1.9%**.

Supervision counts across most districts remained stable from the previous year, with one notable exception: the **Low Supervision Unit (LSU) grew by 11.7%**. Demographic distributions by crime type, gender, and ethnicity remained consistent with FY25. However, regarding age, there was a **significant increase among individuals aged 35-64**, while **18-24 and 65 and older showed a decrease**.

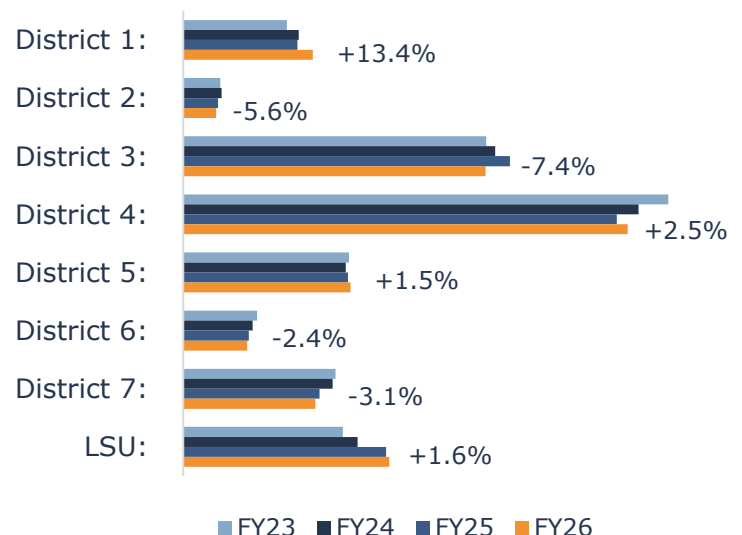

The number of individuals under active supervision across Idaho's districts remained stable aside from **LSU, specifically probation, which increased by 10.1%** from FY25 and FY26.

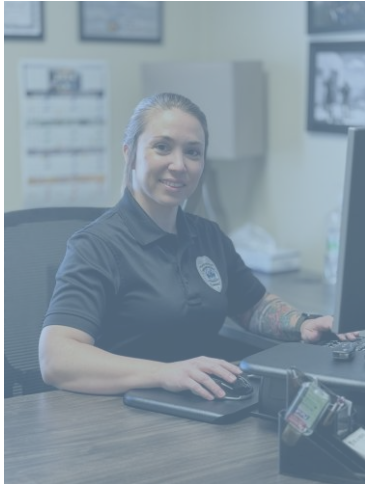

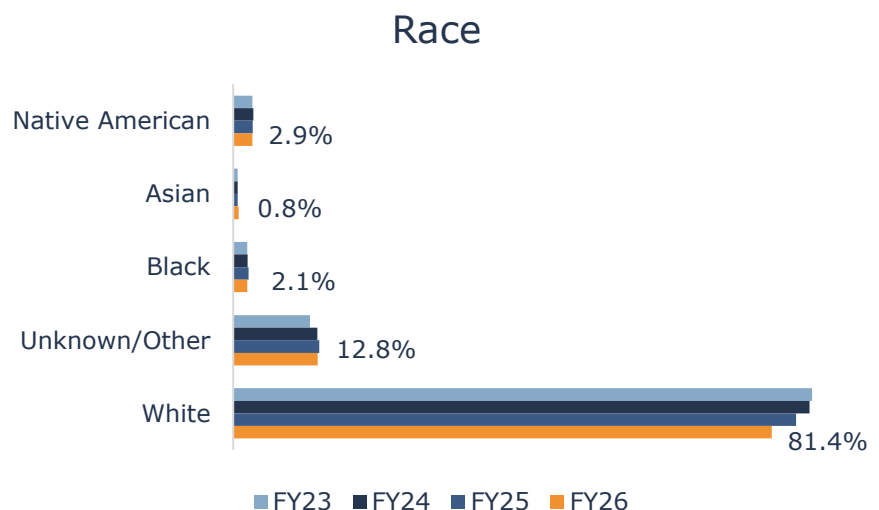
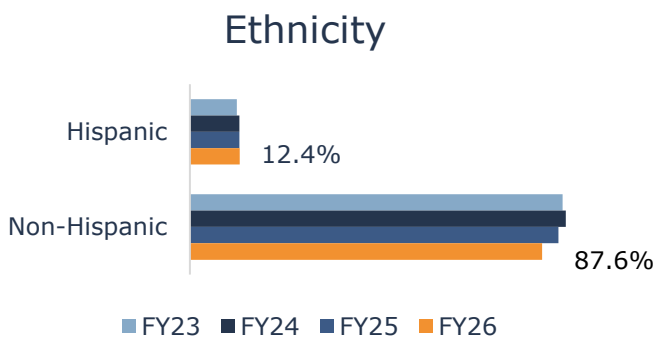
Demographics

Between FY25 and FY26, the gender distribution of those on active supervision showed no significant change, with **males representing 72.2% and females 27.8%** of the population for FY26.

The **45-54 and 55-64 age groups experienced a notable increase of 46.3% and 49.1%**. Other age groups remained relatively stable, with those aged 35-44 continuing to represent the largest segment of the supervised population.



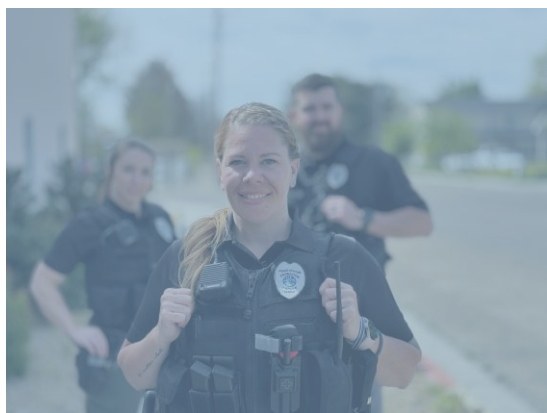
81.4% of people on active supervision are White, a **decrease of 4.3%** since FY25.

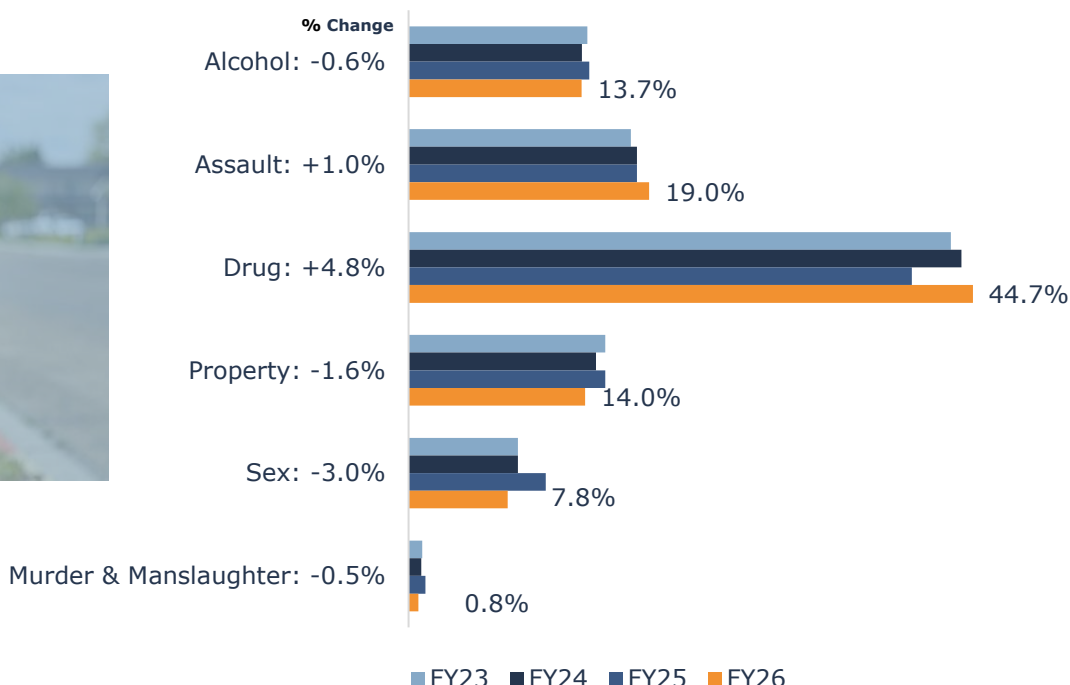

Crime Groups

Of the total active supervised population, **44.7% were sentenced on drug charges, which was an increase of 4.8% from FY25**. People on community supervised for **sex charges decreased by 3.0%** from FY25. Alcohol, assault, murder & manslaughter, and property crime groups remained stable for FY26.
