



Overall Trends

The FY26 incarcerated population **exceeded projections during the first half of the fiscal year** then stabilized. Over the year, there were notable **decreases in the Riders (-11.6%)** and **increases in the Parole Violators (+14.6%)**.

¹Parole Violator: An individual who violates the conditions of their parole. This is usually a temporary status until a hearing can be conducted to determine if their parole will be reinstated or revoked.

²Retained Jurisdiction (Rider): Individuals sentenced to a period of incarceration in an IDOC facility over whom the court has retained jurisdiction. The IDOC assesses riders to determine their needs and places them in the appropriate facilities to receive intensive programming and education. Upon completion of a rider, the court determines whether to place the resident on probation or sentence them to term.

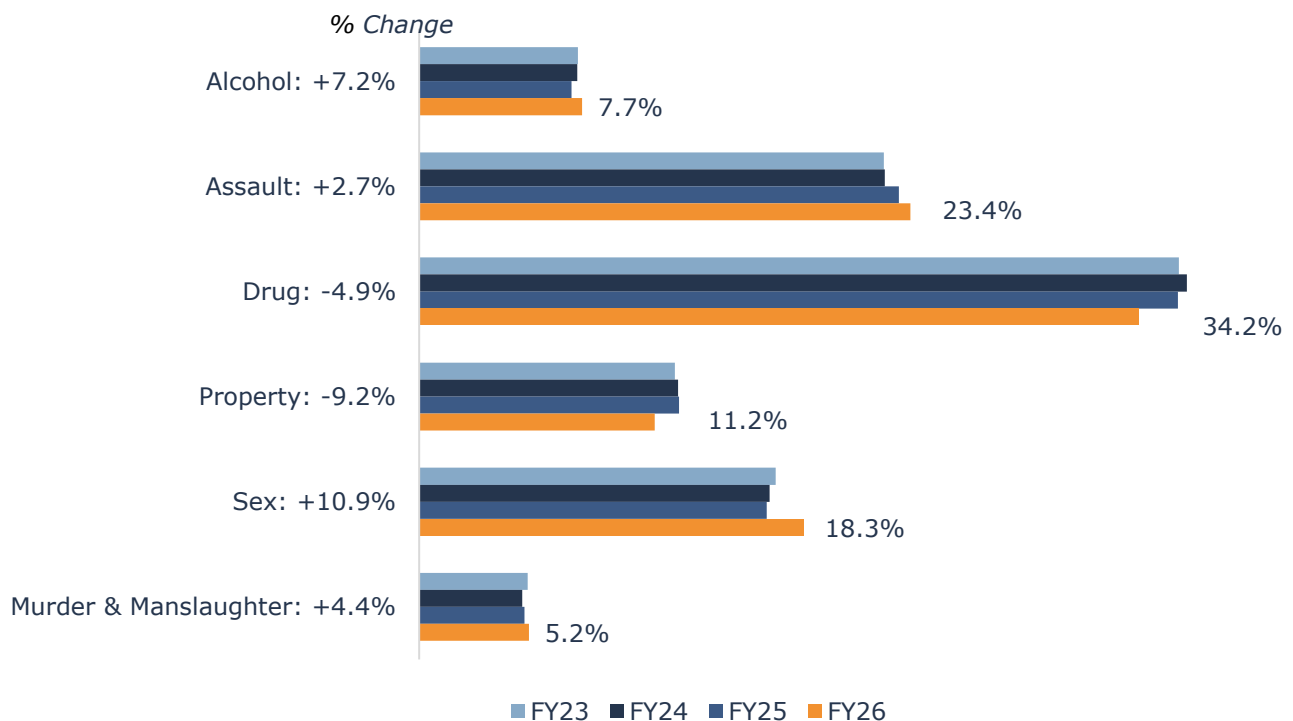

The IDOC incarcerated population had a net increase of 0.1% from FY25 to FY26. Those serving a “term sentence” or “Termer” increased by 1.0%. The Rider population decreased by 11.6%. The Parole Violator population increased by 14.6%.



Crime Groups

The majority of people incarcerated in IDOC facilities have been sentenced for **drug offenses, representing 34.2%** of the total population. While individuals incarcerated for **drug crimes dropped nearly 5%**, more notably was **a nearly 11% increase in sex crimes**. Alcohol (+7.2%), assault (+2.7%), murder/manslaughter (+4.4%). property (-9.2%).

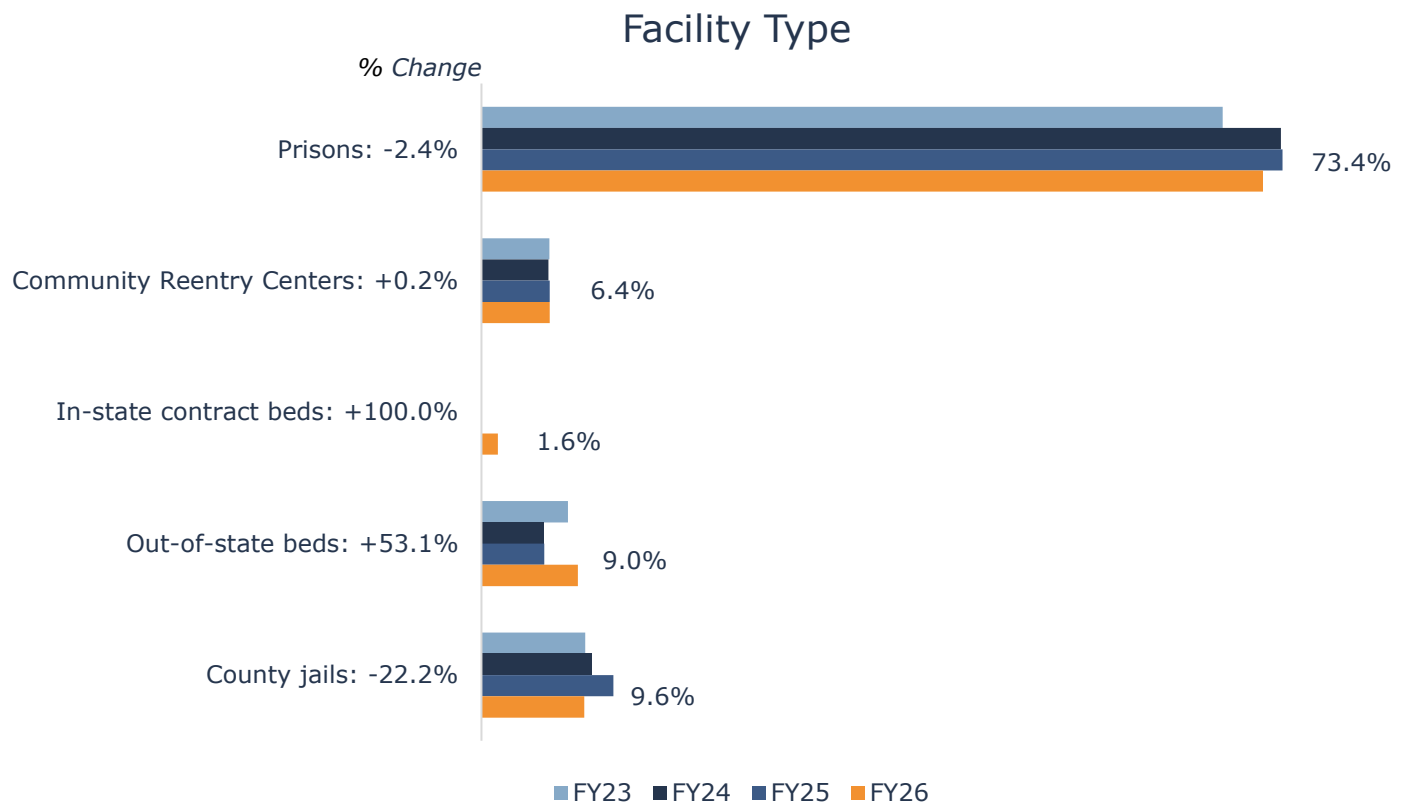

Most people (73.4%) were housed at in-state prison facilities and 6.4% were housed at Community Reentry Centers. In FY26, **county jails accounted for 9.6%**, and there was a backlog of individuals waiting in county jails to get into IDOC facilities. To alleviate this backlog, **IDOC contracted with select county jails** to house residents during FY26. The remaining 9% of people were housed in contracted beds in Arizona.



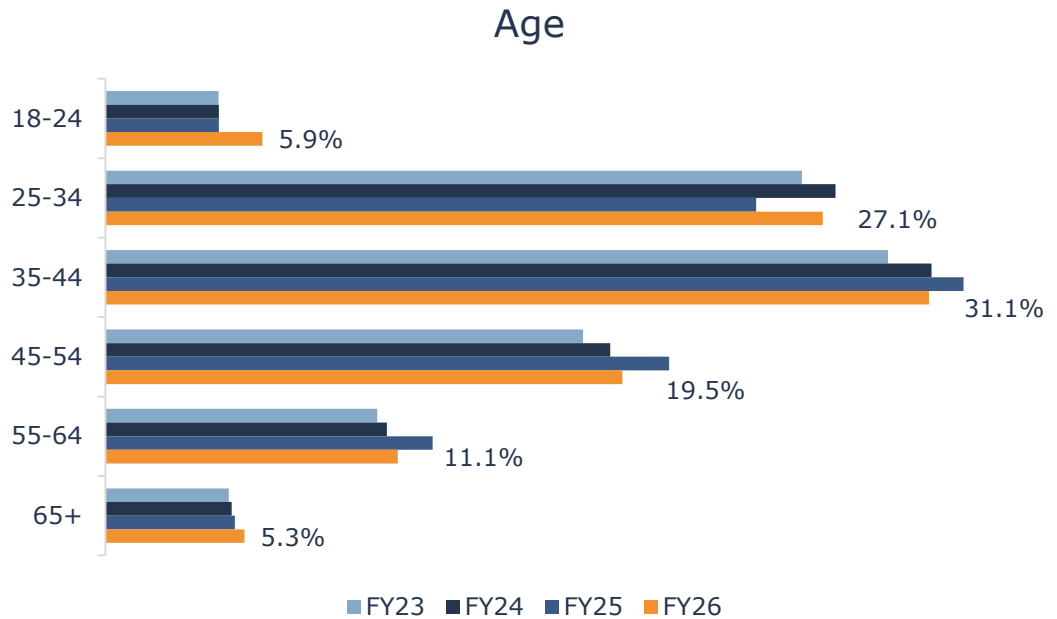

Numbers as of June 30, 2026



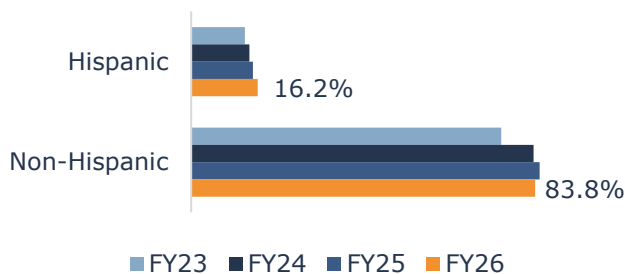
Demographics

Of the total IDOC incarcerated population, 86.3% were male, an increase of 1.1% from FY25. The **largest proportion** of people incarcerated remains **between the ages of 35 to 44**, representing 31.1% of the total incarcerated population.

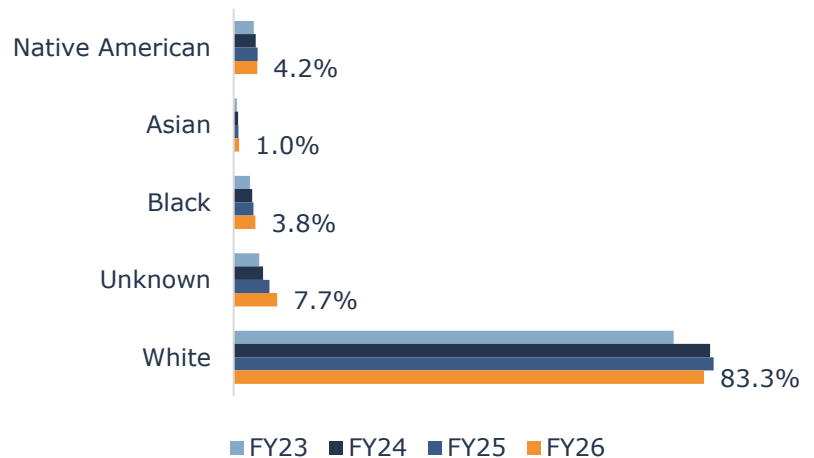
