Need Principle (what)

Target interventions toward each offender's unique need profile to reduce overall risk.

LSI Domain	Central 8 Risk Indicators & Dynamic Needs
Criminal History	History of Antisocial Behavior Risk: Early and continuing involvement in a number and variety of anti social acts in a variety of settings. Need: Build non-criminal alternative behavior in risky situations.
Emotional/ Personal	Anti Social Personality Risk: Impulsive, adventurous, pleasure seeking, relentlessly aggressive and irritable. Need: Build problem solving skills, self management skills and coping skills.
Attitude/ Orientation	Anti Social Cognitions Risk: Attitudes, values, beliefs and rationalization. Need: Reduce anti social cognition, reduce risky thinking, build up alternatives to risky thinking.
Companions	Anti Social Associates Risk: Criminal Friends, isolation from pro-social others. Need: Reduce association with criminal others, enhance association with anti criminal others.
Alcohol/Drug Problems	Substance Abuse Risk: Abuse of alcohol and/or drugs. Need: Reduce substance abuse and increase interpersonal supports for substance abuse.
Family/ Martial	Family / Marital Relationships Risk: Inappropriate parental monitoring and disciplining, poor family relationships. Need: Reduce conflict and build positive relationships, enhance monitoring and supervision.
Education/ Employment	School / Work Risk: Poor performance, low levels of satisfactions. Need: Enhance performance, rewards and satisfactions.
Leisure/ Recreation	Pro Social Recreational Activities Risk: Lack of involvement in pro-social hobbies and sports. Need: Enhance rewards, involvement and satisfaction.
Accommodation	Not a criminogenic need, but links to stability and program success. (ASAM Dimension 6)
Financial	Not a criminogenic need, but links to case management needs.
